- Procedure: letter-selection, pre-selection, assessment, interview with the national selection commitee of senior public prosecutors & HR-advisors

Appointment

- The recruitment, career and conditions of service of prosecutors are governed by the Regulation on the education of judges and prosecutors (Besluit opleiding rechters en officieren van justitie (Boro)), Law on the legal position of judicial officials (Wet rechtspositie rechterlijke ambtenaren(Wrra)) and the Regulation on the legal position of judicial officials (Besluit rechtspositie rechterlijke ambtenaren (Brra))
- Senior prosecutors, including the Procurator General and the chief district prosecutors are formally <u>appointed</u> by the Crown following the recommendation of the Minister of Security and Justice, whereas junior prosecutors are formally appointed by the Minister of Security and Justice.

Learning philosophy

- Every prosecutor in training is:
- the "owner" of his or her own learning process,
- expected to show an active approach to contents and progress of the training and
- offered a stimulating environment in which he or she is able to acquire the required knowledge and skills
- Every new prosecutor is seen as a collegue with his or hers unique talents

Promotion

 Horizontal and vertical <u>mobility</u> is possible within the OM. Horizontal transfers happen under the responsibility of the respective chief district prosecutors. Vertical promotions are decided by the Board of Procurators General, upon recommendation of the respective chief district prosecutor.
